Our MYP Program is still celebrating the news of our authorization which we received at the tail end of last school year. We want to congratulate Garrett Austin, Lesley Peacock and all of last year's MYP Program Teachers as they worked tirelessly through last year to prepare for our program study and visit!

One of the goals of our MYP Team this year is to focus on the IB Approaches to Learning. What are they and why are they important? They are trans-disciplinary skills that are developed in students beginning in PYP, working through MYP, all the way to the DP in IB Schools. They are intended to develop students as lifelong learners and reinforce that we are teachers of learners as well as teachers of subjects.

# May Diploma 2021 results and looking forward to May 2022

Last year, the International Baccalaureate (IB) created a two-track system for schools offering the Diploma Programme (DP), offering both an exam and non-exam option for students to earn their diplomas. The TASOK class of 2021 was placed on the non-exam route, and their results were published over this summer. There are a number things to celebrate for TASOK students in the May 2021 session:

- 9 students earned full IB diplomas, including 3 that earned bilingual diplomas
- The highest score received was 34, with an average score of 28
- 10 cases were students received a score of 6 out of 7 in a subject

Despite a number of disruptions to the two year programme, our students were still able to finish strong and celebrate their accomplishments, and we'd love to give them a round of applause.

The class of 2022 is on track to take their exams in May of next year. They will receive a number of accommodations due to disruptions caused by COVID-19. This includes the removal or amendment of assessment components to address the loss of instruction time over the past year, while ensuring the following objectives are met for all DP students:

- Rich, authentic, and integrated curriculum for all subjects studied
- Varied, valid, and reliable assessments of student learning
- Standards and expectations comparable to prior DP exam sessions

All adaptations aim to empower teachers to address their subject objectives with flexibility and fairness in preparation for the exam session during these challenging times.

## Welcome TASOK Families!

Congratulations on your enrollment for 2021-2022. We are currently reviewing all tuition accounts to make sure all is in order for Semester 1. With Admissions still open, new students are arriving to TASOK this week and next.

We continue to issue invoices and tuition agreements to parents to new and returning families. You can follow the instructions on the letter for payments and return the signed agreements as soon as possible.



Note that all transmission is done electronically. Contact us if you have not received the (re) enrollment documents from us.

Payments are accepted through our online portal or via direct deposits or bank transfers to the school accounts. The tuition rates are published on our website **Tuition & Registration Fees 2021-2022**.

### **Important Notes**

- The Capital Development (\$4000) & Admission (\$300) fees are one-time & non-refundable
- . The enrollment & (re) enrollment \$1000-deposit for placement/seat guarantee is non-refundable
- . Late payment penalties start to apply in September
- · The late fee is 5% of the balance owed
- · Bank charges are the responsibility of the issuer




## Should Someone in Your Family/Household Test Positive for COVID-19:

- 1. Keep your child and all siblings home from school and isolate.
- 2. Immediately consult a doctor and have everyone in the household tested for COVID-19
  - 1. This includes all TASOK students (regardless of age)
    - 2. This includes all family members in the household
- 3. Immediately inform the school of your situation and all symptom/testing details so that we can start the contact tracing process.
- 4. Quarantine as recommended for up to 14 days until all family members retest negative.
- 5. Provide the Nurse with a negative COVID-19 test result and follow instructions.
- 6. Students will not be allowed to return until all family members have tested negative.

## Should a Family Member of a Student in Your Child's Class Test Positive for COVID-19:

- 1. Once the school is notified (Step 3 above), we may ask the remainder of students in that grade level (and teacher) to test or stay home and isolate until the student in question has COVID test results submitted to the school (Step 2 above).
- 2. If the test result is **POSITIVE** the remaining students in that grade level (and teacher) will be required to have a COVID-19 test **AND** all siblings will be asked to remain at home until the test results are in.
- 3. If the test result is **NEGATIVE** the remaining students in that grade level (and teacher) will return to school and resume normal instruction.


## September 8-10- ES Open House
