What do you do at TASOK?

I have been Tasok's Swimming Pool Caretaker for 37 years. I maintain the HS Boys and Girls Change Rooms and the Covered Court as well as marking the lines on the HS & ES School soccer fields. I am also part of the coaching staff for the High School and Middle School girls soccer teams as part of the ASA's at Tasok and the upcoming Tasok Soccer Tournament in June.

What do you do at TASOK?

I serve as the inventory officer for the Business Office (School Supplies and Fixed Assets). I am the Business Office IT support and liaison to the IT department.

How long have you worked at TASOK?

I started at Tasok in 1983 which is 39 years in total. I have seen many students going from PreSchool all the way to Grade 12. I have worked with many Directors and Maintenance Managers.

How long have you worked at TASOK?

I started at TASOK in 2009. So that makes 13 years already.

What province are you from/which Kinshasa commune do you live in?

I am originally from Kongo Central.I live in Ngaliema commune. Area Binza Ozone Quarter Nfinda Loya Ave. 44. I am happily married with seven children. I have 5 girls and 2 boys.

What province are you from/which Kinshasa commune do you live in?

I am from Goma in the North-Kivu province (DRC East). My first language is Swahili. I am also fluent in French and Lingala. In Kinshasa, I live in the area of Pompage in the Ngaliema Commune.

I've been married for 10 years and have 4 beautiful children (2 boys and 2 girls).

What do you appreciate about TASOK?

I appreciate the work I have been given at Tasok and being part of the sporting activities as a player, coach and referee. It has helped me raise my family over the years. Meeting people from all over the world has always been interesting.

What do you appreciate about TASOK?

I like the work environment and the way it aligns with TASOK's vision (Integrity, Inclusivity & Excellence). About Excellence, every year we have the opportunity to improve. I can see my own progress over the years, and our system has also improved for better coordination between departments.

What job accomplishment are you most proud of during

What job accomplishment are you most proud of during your

your time at TASOK?

Helping the security team look after Tasok during the 1991 Pillage of the DRC formerly known as Zaire because the security team was not big enough. The Security Wall was also different then as it was a Diamond Mesh Fence which allowed people to see into the school property which made the security work more challenging at the time. There was one day when none of the Tasok Soccer coaches arrived for the Soccer Tournament which I had to manage myself and share the refereeing of the games played that day with other visiting coaches. I have enjoyed being part of many Sporting Tournaments at Tasok and I am looking forward to being part of the upcoming Soccer Tournament in June that Tasok will host after a two year break as a result of Covid 19. It is also really great sharing my Culture with the students in the CAC during Congo Week.

I established a better system of communication for delivery with the maintenance department. With the rigorous procedures of inventory and control, I am able to implement the tasks and see the results right away.

The big highlight is the dispatch of overseas supplies to classrooms, offices and residences at the start of every school-year. It is a massive endeavor that requires good coordination and teamwork.



What are you most proud of in the DRC?

I am proud of the Cultural Diversity of the DRC with 200 ethnic languages and over 400 dialects.

What do you do as a hobby?

I really enjoy playing soccer at home and here at Tasok with the students and staff after hours. I tried playing the guitar and the piano but I realized that my music happened when playing soccer and being part of scoring goals that made the players and spectators sing and dance.

What are you most proud of in the DRC?

I like the generosity of the people. Congolese people are very welcoming. I particularly like the city of Goma. It's a beautiful city bursting with new constructions and where food is always available and cheap.

What do you do as a hobby?

During my free time, I practice Taekwondo. I like Math, Programming and Technology. I assist some children in the family and neighborhood with Math questions or problems.

With Taekwondo, I had the opportunity of offering 2 after-school activities to students at TASOK in Elementary School this year. It was a great experience, especially with the youngest. It was a learning process to effectively manage Kindergarteners and first graders; definitely a challenge to keep fun and order.

What do you appreciate in your current position?

I appreciate being part of the good Team at Tasok working together as one community that helps students with a great learning experience at Tasok through Sport and Education.

What do you appreciate in your current position?

The communication within the business office creates a good teamwork mentality. We help each other get better. I like the flexibility and opportunities to work in other areas such as the safety team (morning drop-offs), IT (joint interventions), Atelier (constant dispatching and equipment movement) and office (supplies delivery).

Summer is for Choice




53% of kids say they enjoy reading over the summer

STEAM Fest is now STEAM Week- Events will take place in the green space where Music Fridays take place. Parents are welcome to come in for the assemblies and sharing.



Payment Options - Reminder

TASOK offers families and companies the convenience of making tuition payments online. To provide this method of payment, we partner with Diamond Mind/Community Brands, an independent school payment service provider. All payment information is completely secure using the highest security standards in the industry.

WEBSITE OPTION

Go to the school website's "Payment Portal" link, or enter it directly clicking here: PAYMENT PORTAL

- Sign-up to set up an online account;
- Enter student first name, last name and ID with payment information; the student ID # is on the invoice;
- Submit payment. Payment acceptance methods and any fees associated with an electronic payment are outlined in the payment portal.

MOBILE OPTION

You can also pay using our mobile payment app: MySchoolWallet

Signing into the MySchoolWallet App for the first time?

- Go to the App Store on your phone.
- Search for MySchoolWallet and install.
- Complete your profile and select
 The American School of Kinshasa as your school and hit PAY.
- You will see various events and departments, listed as payment types. Select one of the payment types and follow the onscreen directions. Be sure to complete the student's name and fill out the NOTE with what the payment is for (for example, Tuition or Student).

- Please check the box "I would like to absorb processing costs so that the school receives my whole payment." Each transaction incurs a processing cost from the bank.
- Once your transaction has gone through, you will receive an email confirmation and receipt.

Note that payments can be made via credit card (worldwide), debit card or echeck (for US accounts only). For online payments, receipts are automatically generated after each transaction.

BANKING OPTION

- Direct deposits (cash or check) at bank counters into TASOK's account are accepted.
- Wire or ACH transfers are accepted.
- Online banking from your bank DRC or US bank to ours is possible. Check with your institution for options available to you.
- Most US transfer options work: wire, ACH, e-check, BillPay, Zelle, etc... These options are only available for US transactions, not international.
- Once the transaction is complete, send the confirmation to us.





ON CAMPUS OPTION

- TASOK has an ATM station on campus. The ATM machine is located just outside of the Administration Building.
- TASOK Cashier Office accepts debit and credit cards for payments via POS. Both ATM & POS accept VISA ® & Mastercard ®.
- TASOK Cashier Office accepts paper checks issued to The American School of Kinshasa. Checks from a local DRC or US bank are accepted.

Help is available at the office to help you navigate the TASOK website and experiment with the tuition portal or the mobile app! If you need copies of invoices/agreements or would like a receipt for your payment, please email accounts@tasok.net.


