<p>What job accomplishment are you most proud of during your time at TASOK?</p> <p>I am proud of being part of the 50 year anniversary celebration of TASOK where I worked together with Inge Sthreshley who was a former parent and board member at TASOK. We cleaned out the Upper Botanical Garden which had a lot of vines and the invasive air potatoes and replanted trees and various plants to make it a beautiful environment for students to experience and learn about nature. This included planting 50 trees on the TASOK campus. It was a community project involving past and present students, teachers, board members and the US Ambassador at the time.</p>	<p>What job accomplishment are you most proud of during your time at TASOK?</p> <p>I am proud of all of the goals that students and teachers have achieved over the years with my support. For example, I assisted a student very closely and helped him with assigned work and tasks. I am proud that he not only advanced academically, but he also developed self-management skills.</p> <p>What are you most proud of in the DRC?</p> <p>I am proud of the culture. As Congolese, we have different cultures in different provinces. There are many different types of foods and musical traditions. We are one country with a lot of diversity.</p>
<p>What are you most proud of in the DRC?</p> <p>I am proud of the diverse culture, mineral and natural wealth in the DRC including the mighty Congo River.</p> <p>What do you do as a hobby?</p> <p>My hobby is maybe a bit different as I enjoy spending time in the villages on the outskirts of Kinshasa observing the plants and trees with their many different flowers and colors. So even though my work here at TASOK is gardening, it's also my hobby when I am on vacation. This inspires me to be the gardening artist at TASOK.</p>	<p>What do you do as a hobby?</p> <p>During my free time, I swim. I like swimming. I also do aerobic workouts and crossfit.</p>
<p>What do you appreciate in your current position?</p> <p>I really enjoy being a creative artist using all the flowers and trees. This can be planting new flower beds and replacing trees to make flower arrangements for the TASOK Gala, TASOK graduation and Congo Week as well as the flower arrangements welcoming the new staff to their homes at TASOK.</p>	<p>What do you appreciate in your current position?</p> <p>I appreciate working with different educators and learning more from them. Since I've been here, we have had three different principals, and each one brought different perspectives. Each year, I am learning more.</p>

An IB Education: building a better world

MYP Service as Action (SA) and DP Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS) challenge students to become real change makers. 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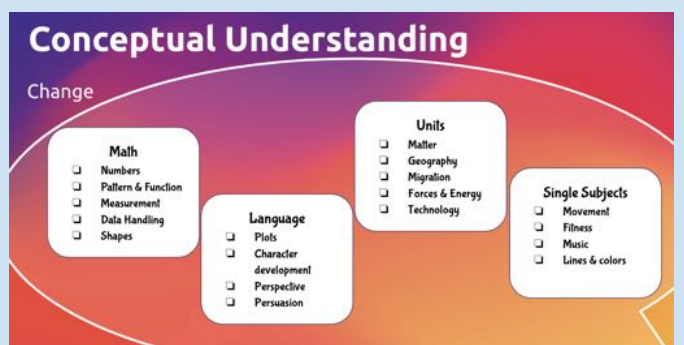
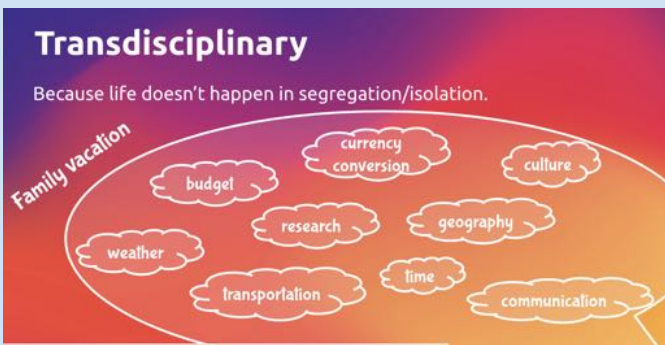
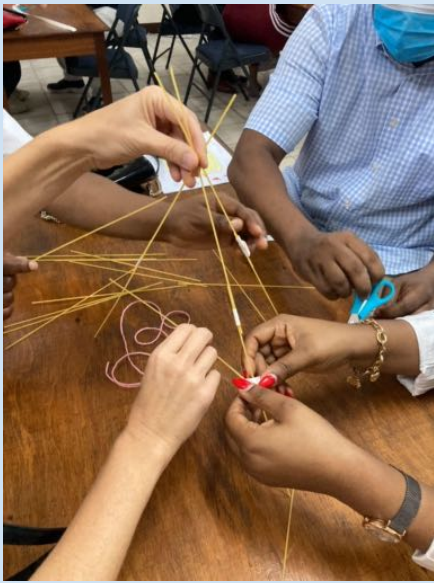

MYP Coordinator Update

We can't believe it's already October and almost halfway through the first semester! This is the time we want to encourage students to make sure they're staying organized and keeping up on their work. Please support us by encouraging your student to use their MYP Planner to stay organized and keep up with what's due and when.

We've had some questions asked about **Get It Done**, our club that meets in the library on Tuesdays and Thursdays to help support students keeping up with their classwork and homework. Here are a few facts that might help you as a parent support your student:

GET IT DONE CLUB

When: Tuesdays and Thursdays 3:25-4:25

Where: TASOK Secondary School Library

Who: * Students are assigned to GID by a teacher when they have not turned work in or turned in incomplete assignments

Who: *Students not assigned may also choose to attend if they are looking for a quiet & focused place to work on their homework

How: If your student is assigned by a teacher, parents will receive a "Behavior Note" through ManageBac notifying them of the Late/Missed classwork and the day your student is assigned.

How: If a student gets the work turned in to the assigning teacher early in the day they are assigned to GID, the teacher can excuse them. This does not apply

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if the work is turned in at the last minute or without time for the teacher to look it over and excuse them from GID. If this does not happen, they are expected to attend and work on other homework.

Why: In an MYP/DP Programme we work on Approaches to Learning (ATL) skills. This includes Self-Management and also Communication skills relevant to students being able to organize themselves to get work completed and communicating with teachers when they have late or missing work. GID helps students to build these skills in a supportive environment.

May 2023 Examination Session Update

After two years of disruptions due to COVID, the IB plans for students completing the DP in May 2023 to undertake the full suite of assessments. That means a return to the published model for all subjects and components. However, the IB recognizes that students have been affected by the disruption of the pandemic, and this will be taken into account when determining grades for students.

A new feature of the DP exams in May 2023 will be the creation of three different exam zones for scheduling exams, with a common start and finish time for all schools in each zone. This is to ensure the academic integrity of the examinations and to preserve the recognition of IB qualifications. The IB is committed to ensure that students receive valid, recognized and meaningful results from the DP, and so is TASOK.

Our DP team is already in the thick of things preparing our students to complete the program next May. Extended essays are almost done, and most subjects are in the middle of working on their internal assessments. I've been working with students to begin the process of registering for their exams. It's an exciting, and stressful, time to be a grade 12 DP student, and we're all doing our best to finish strong.

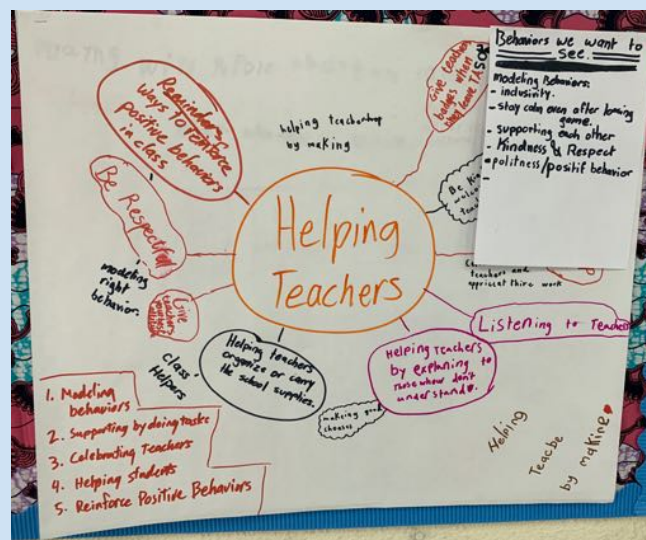
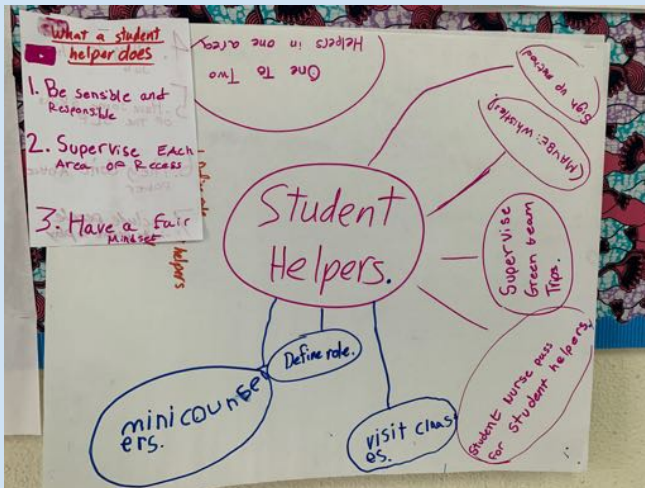
ES is represented!

Celebration of Learning: How We Express Ourselves

Grade 4 students capped off six weeks of inquiry into culture and media by teaching parents and students about their research into different digital platforms and issues in the media. Student teams chose topics as varied as responsible use of Google docs and email (this is their first year with TASOK email access!); different perspectives on Roblox, Tiktok and Instagram; and sexism and ableism in the media. Ms. Kezia, Ms. Abigail, Ms. Hall, Ms. TaShawndra and Ms. Meritaton made deep connections between their areas of expertise and our unit, and we were able to share work from art, music, and French classes too!

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Grade 5 Trip to the Bonobos

Grade five went to Lola Ya Bonobo on 22 September 2022 to finish our unit of inquiry about conflict and resolution. We were amazed to see great apes so close to Kinshasa. Let me tell you how it went.

We got to see a whole presentation on bonobos, and we noted down some facts from it. Here are some of them: bonobos are only from the Democratic Republic of Congo; they don't like deep water; they can't swim; we have 98% of the same DNA as them; there used to be more than 100,000 of them, but now there are under 20,000 of them left. One reason for the population decline is that people take them when they are small to be pets because they are cute. When the bonobos get bigger, they become dangerous, and then the people sometimes kill them. Some people even eat them.

We walked pretty far uphill to see the bonobos, but it was worth it. We had a very good time and were happy to see them.

This optional test is typically taken by students that may be looking for university options in the United States.

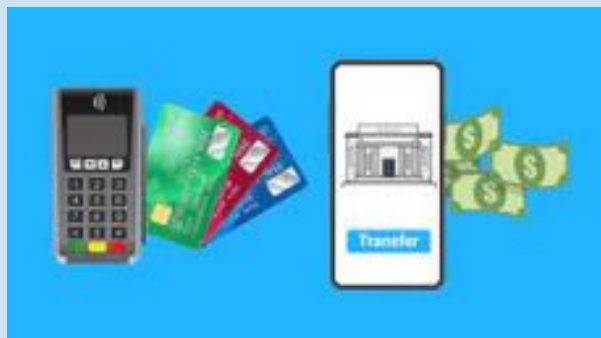

TASOK offers families and companies the convenience of making tuition payments as we miscellaneous purchases/bill settlements online.

We partner with Diamond Mind/Community Brands, an independent school payment service provider. All payment information is completely secure using the highest security standards in the industry.



WEBSITE OPTION

Go to the school website's "Payment Portal" link, or enter it directly clicking here:

PAYMENT PORTAL

- Sign-up to set up an online account;
- Enter student first name, last name and ID with payment information; the student ID # is on the invoice;

- Submit payment. Payment acceptance methods and any fees associated with an electronic payment are outlined in the payment portal.

MOBILE OPTION

You can also pay using our mobile payment app: MySchoolWallet©

Signing into the MySchoolWallet App for the first time?

- Go to the App Store on your phone.
- Search for MySchoolWallet and install.
- Complete your profile and select The American School of Kinshasa as your school and hit PAY.
- You will see various events and departments, listed as payment types. Select one of the payment types and follow the onscreen directions. Be sure to complete the student's name and fill out the NOTE with what the payment is for (for example, Tuition or Student Store, **Student Play, Night Run**, etc...)
- Please check the box "I would like to absorb processing costs so that the school receives my whole payment." Each transaction incurs a processing cost from the bank.
- Once your transaction has gone through, you will receive an email confirmation and receipt.



Note that payments can be made via credit card (worldwide), debit card or echeck (for US accounts only). For online payments, receipts are automatically generated after each transaction.

Note TASOK systems do not accept payments for the canteen orders. All must use the EKONZOFOOD platform to replenish their account and order lunch. See the details posted on our website.

BANKING OPTION

- Direct deposits (cash or check) at bank counters into TASOK's account are accepted.
- Wire or ACH transfers are accepted.
- Online banking from your bank DRC or US bank to ours is possible. Check with your institution for options available to you.
- Most US transfer options work: wire, ACH, e-check, BillPay, Zelle, etc... These options are only available for US transactions, not international.
- Once the transaction is complete, send the confirmation to us.

ON CAMPUS OPTION

- TASOK Cashier Office accepts cash up to 1,000 USD.
- TASOK Cashier Office accepts debit and credit cards for payments via POS. Both ATM & POS accept VISA ® & Mastercard ®.
- TASOK Cashier Office accepts paper checks issued to The American School of Kinshasa. Checks from a local DRC or US bank are accepted.
