Self-Management: The role of conferences

In an IB School, conferences should focus on the **process** of learning, rather than making products of learning the focal point. This is a small, but significant change from traditional educational systems. Conferences allow teachers, parents, and students to discuss this process of learning. In the MYP and DP we ask students to become increasingly responsible for reflecting on their learning and managing themselves as learners. Conferences play a vital role in this growth, allowing students to share their own experiences and thoughts on their learning. You may find that much of the conference consists of questions posed to the student:

- What have you enjoyed most about what we have studied/learned so far this semester in class?
- What areas/skills are your strengths in this class?
- What areas/skills are you working on to improve? How are you doing that?
- In what ways do you contribute to learning in the class with others?
- How can I (the teacher) support you in doing well in this class?
- How might your parents or other adults support you in learning in this class?

We hope the conference experience will provide you with an opportunity to hear about your child's experiences, their strengths, and areas they are working to develop and grow. Most importantly, we hope to continue to build a stronger school-home relationship. Conferences will be held in individual teacher's rooms. We also welcome you to meet with our EAL Coordinator, Learning Support Coordinator & Staff, and Secondary Counselor during this time in their rooms.

3-Way Conference

Vitna Bailey - PYP coordinator Three-way conferences are on the way!

Three-way conferences are scheduled on Friday, November 4. Students, parents, and teachers will meet together to celebrate students' learning and share goals that will improve their progress. These conferences are designed to give parents and teachers, with the student, an opportunity to discuss information about the student's progress, development, and needs and to review their goals. It is a part of the reporting process at TASOK. As students move up through the grades they will be expected to take on greater responsibilities during this conference. If you are new to the three-way conference, please note that students are active participants at the conference. At TASOK we develop and nurture student agency by providing opportunities for them to share their voice, make choices, and show ownership of their learning and school life.

It is important to recognize and celebrate what the student is doing well and to build on their strengths. Parents can listen to their child, ask questions, encourage the student to expand and explain information further, and share what they see as strengths and goals for their child.

Meetings with single-subject teachers are on a drop in basis. You can stop by and speak with them without an appointment. If you have specific questions or concerns, reach out to your child's teacher and share your questions or concerns ahead of time. It will help save time and use the conference time more effectively.

Please take advantage of the learning share space that is set up for each grade level on the conference day. Your child will be a great guide to walk you through the learning that's been going on in the class. We look forward to having you on the conference day!

MYP Coordinator Update


















Diploma Programme Coordinator Update

Academic Integrity



Academic integrity is a key principle of the IB programmes, and a requirement for successfully completing the Diploma Programme. It involves acting in a responsible way to ensure that students are giving credit where credit is due, and to be honest and transparent about how others' work has influenced and supported their own. Here are some tips to help ensure that students are acting with integrity during this busy, and stressful, time of the DP.

- Understand the rules familiarize yourself with the schools academic integrity policy
- Always act with honesty you have an influence on those around you and should be a role model of integrity.
- Stand up for what is right if you know or suspect someone has participated in academic misconduct, speak out. It is a shared responsibility to develop and maintain integrity.
- Don't try to gain unfair advantages your work should reflect what you know and what you are capable of.
- Take responsibility you are in charge of your education, take responsibility for your actions and their consequences
- References always reference and cite other people's work that you have used. Seek help if you are struggling or don't understand when and how to do so.
- Safely collaborate be mindful of academic integrity when working collaboratively to ensure all due credit is given.
- Overcome procrastination the most common cause of academic misconduct is when students fall behind and make poor choices to catch up. Manage your time wisely, and use Get it Done as a tool!





Signing into the MySchoolWallet App for the first time?

- Go to the App Store on your phone.
- Search for MySchoolWallet and install.
- Complete your profile and select
 The American School of Kinshasa as your school and hit PAY.
- You will see various events and departments, listed as
 payment types. Select one of the payment types and
 follow the onscreen directions. Be sure to complete the
 student's name and fill out the NOTE with what the payment is for (for example,
 Tuition or Student Store, Student Play, Night Run, etc...)
- Please check the box "I would like to absorb processing costs so that the school receives my whole payment." Each transaction incurs a processing cost from the bank.
- Once your transaction has gone through, you will receive an email confirmation and receipt.

Note that payments can be made via credit card (worldwide), debit card or echeck (for US accounts only). For online payments, receipts are automatically generated after each transaction.

Note TASOK systems do not accept payments for the canteen orders. All <u>must</u> use the EKONZOFOOD platform to replenish their account and order lunch. See the details posted on our website.

BANKING OPTION

- Direct deposits (cash or check) at bank counters into TASOK's account are accepted.
- Wire or ACH transfers are accepted.
- Online banking from your bank DRC or US bank to ours is possible. Check with your institution for options available to you.
- Most US transfer options work: wire, ACH, e-check, BillPay, Zelle, etc... These options are only available for US transactions, not international.
- Once the transaction is complete, send the confirmation to us.

ON CAMPUS OPTION

- TASOK Cashier Office accepts cash up to 1,000 USD.
- TASOK Cashier Office accepts debit and credit cards for payments via POS. Both ATM & POS accept VISA ® & Mastercard ®.
- TASOK Cashier Office accepts paper checks issued to The American School of Kinshasa. Checks from a local DRC or US bank are accepted.


