I am from the province of Kasai Central, and I currently live in the commune of Mont Ngafula.

What do you appreciate about TASOK?

I appreciate how Tasok takes care of the Environment on the Tasok Campus. I enjoy harvesting the mushrooms and palm nuts and caterpillars. Where I live there are no trees and flowers like Tasok which is a bit sad.

What do you appreciate about TASOK?

TASOK has such a tight knit community that it's easy to fall in love with it and simply feel welcomed by everyone. I have been in TASOK for quite a few years now and there has never been a day where I didn't look forward to coming to work. Our job in the admin office is pretty much giving a hand to everybody on campus. And being the community person that I am, it always feels fulfilling helping someone out.

What job accomplishment are you most proud of during your time at TASOK?

One year we had a huge storm that caused a lot of damage. A galvanized roof with its wooden structure was picked by the strong winds and deposited into the Tasok Campus damaging a Avo Tree including many other trees in front of Admin all the way up to the top of the Campus where the Atelier is situated. The storm started in the morning and the same day we cleaned it up using two axes. It was a big job.

What job accomplishment are you most proud of during your time at TASOK?

We had an office party recently and I won a bottle opener during the raffle ticket that was held there. As far as I can remember, that is the only thing I can recall in terms of accomplishments when it comes to working here. But Like I said previously, helping the TASOK community is forever fulfilling. And I believe that is an accomplishment in itself that I will be forever proud of.

Out of all six, Naruto really stands out for me because of its origin story. What really marked me about this Animé was the origin story. Right before the mortal fight, the man's wife lost her life during labor, and the person responsible for her death was the one that released the spirit. 

Some of these tasks are covering the reception every morning and answering the security radio, doing English-French/French-English/English-Lingala/... translations when needed, taking care of the supply deliveries, and organizing refreshments for routine meetings and sometimes for very important ones.

Why are administrators always talking about attendance?

Sarah Clover -Secondary Principal

I love that Mr. Michael-Ashley starts Music Fridays with a simple message of appreciation and acknowledgment for those who are present, those who have shown up to be "there" for themselves and others in our community. This is the fourth school I've had the privilege to be a part of and while there are differences in each school the role that attendance, simply being present, plays in both a student's success and a school's success remains a constant.

What we know from research and what I have personally experienced in my roles as teacher, coordinator and administrator is that there is a strong correlation between consistent attendance and a student meeting their academic and social/emotional growth potential. Most students miss a few days throughout the school year without long-term consequences. But, when they miss many days the consequence is inevitably negative. Students who are "chronically absent" those missing more than 10% of the school year (that's less than 2 days a month) end up missing nearly a semester of their education across just 4 years. Most conversations I have with parents about a student being behind academically or in their social/emotional development almost always includes an element of attendance as an issue. Every single class missed is a lost opportunity for learning and making connections.

But, it's not just about individual students. A community that has many "chronically absent" students can impact the entire group. In IB schools especially learning is constructed and strengthened through connection with others. It's harder for everyone to learn when others aren't there to contribute their knowledge, beliefs and understanding to the collective group of learners. It can also impact staff morale, as professional educators see first hand the lost opportunities when students miss out.

The Secondary Semester 1 Report Cards include information about attendance (present, late and absent) from individual classes and homeroom. Please take a moment to review this with your family and share some thoughts with your student(s) about the positive impact making a commitment to being at school every day, for every class can have on their learning and personal development.

MUN - Trip to THIMUN in the Hague

The THIMUN (The Hague International Model United Nations) conference is a four-day simulation of the United Nations for secondary school students, which takes place at the end of January each year in the World Forum Convention Center in The Hague. THIMUN attracts students and teachers from around 200 schools all over the world. The students themselves originate from more than 100 different countries. This year, TASOK sent a delegation of nine students representing Malaysia (in the simulation). Each member discussed, debated, and negotiated on a wide variety of issues, including:

- Strengthening of security and cooperation in the Black Sea region
- Repatriation of arts and cultural artifacts in the post-colonial age
- Land grabbing in Less Economically Developed Countries [LEDCs]

The 2022-2023 PYP Exhibition (PYPX) is on the way! PYP exhibition is the culminating, collaborative experience in the final year of the IB Primary Years Programme. Students will explore, document, and share their understanding of an issue or opportunity of personal significance. This year's exhibition unit transdisciplinary theme is Who We Are; An inquiry into the nature of the self; beliefs and values; personal, physical, mental, social and spiritual health; human relationships including families, friends, communities and cultures; rights and responsibilities; what it means to be human. Grade 5 students are working hard to consolidate their understanding of how key concepts are driving their inquiry and to

develop their approaches to learning skills (ATLs). The exhibition unit 'Who We Are' starts on Feb. 20 and ends on Apr. 28. They will need your encouragement and support throughout this exciting learning journey. It is imperative that students are present at school throughout the process collaborating with their group members. TASOK multiple Payment Options

TASOK offers families and companies the convenience of making tuition payments as we miscellaneous purchases/bill settlements online.

We partner with Diamond Mind/Community Brands, an independent school payment service provider. All payment information is completely secure using the highest security standards in the industry.



WEBSITE OPTION

Go to the school website's "Payment Portal" link, or enter it directly clicking here: PAYMENT PORTAL

- Sign-up to set up an online account;
- Enter student first name, last name and ID with payment information; the student ID # is on the invoice;
- Submit payment. Payment acceptance methods and any fees associated with an electronic payment are outlined in the payment portal.

You can also pay using our mobile payment app: MySchoolWallet©

Signing into the MySchoolWallet App for the first time?

- Go to the App Store on your phone.
- Search for MySchoolWallet and install.
- Complete your profile and select
 The American School of Kinshasa as your school and hit PAY.
- You will see various events and departments, listed as payment types. Select one of the payment types and follow the onscreen directions. Be sure to complete the student's name and fill out the NOTE with what the payment is for (for example, Tuition or Student Store, Student Play, Night Run, **Sports Trip**, etc...)



- Please check the box "I would like to absorb processing costs so that the school receives my whole payment." Each transaction incurs a processing cost from the bank.
- Once your transaction has gone through, you will receive an email confirmation and receipt.

Note that payments can be made via credit card (worldwide), debit card or echeck (for US accounts only). For online payments, receipts are automatically generated after each transaction.

Note TASOK systems do not accept payments for the canteen orders. All <u>must</u> use the EKONZOFOOD platform to replenish their account and order lunch. See the details posted on our website.

BANKING OPTION

- Direct deposits (cash or check) at bank counters into TASOK's account are accepted.
- Wire or ACH transfers are accepted.
- Online banking from your bank DRC or US bank to ours is possible. Check with your institution for options available to you.
- Most US transfer options work: wire, ACH, e-check, BillPay, Zelle, etc... These options are only available for US transactions, not international.
- Once the transaction is complete, send the confirmation to us.

ON CAMPUS OPTION

- TASOK Cashier Office accepts cash up to 1,000 USD.
- TASOK Cashier Office accepts debit and credit cards for payments via POS. Both ATM & POS accept VISA ® & Mastercard ®.
- TASOK Cashier Office accepts paper checks issued to The American School of Kinshasa. Checks from a local DRC or US bank are accepted.


