## **SS** Asynchronous Learning

Asynchronous Learning will involve the last week of Semester 1. All assessed work will be collected prior to December 8th. Students will be engaging in reflection activities from December 11- December 15th. Following the holiday break, students will begin with Asynchronous Learning for the first 2 weeks of Semester 2 from January 8th-January 15th and January 18-19th. Please note that for students in Grade 6, 7 and 8 this will include changing Arts (Visual & Performing Arts). They will have one class in advance with the new teacher. All other classes and teachers will remain the same.

With a goal to remain paperless Secondary Asynchronous Learning will utilize three aspects to have students remain connected and organized:

- 1) Asynchronous Electronic folders available on ManageBac, TASOK Website and downloaded on the students' own device with PDFs, videos and any other materials needed to access. Distributed from December 4th - December 6th to all students.
- 2) Daily planners in the Asynchronous Folder that outlines the class learning objective, must do tasks and extension activities. Distributed from December 4th - December 6th to all students.
- 3) Flash drives provided for students to copy materials to their own device and for other larger files. Distributed from December 4th - December 6th to all students.

In addition, students will have other optional ways to access materials to turn-in assignments during Asynchronous Learning or engage in extension activities.

- 4) **Optional:** Links to all documents on ManageBac and extension activities for students with internet access.
- 5) **Optional:** on-line Library resources for students with internet access.

Students and parents will also have access to optional check-ins with teachers daily from 14:00-16:30 WAT based on the A Day/B Day schedule for the classes that day. Please email the teacher directly to participate in check-ins. All teacher emails can be found from p. 40 in the TASOK SS Family Handbook

## **ES** Asynchronous Learning

ES Asynchronous Learning will involve the last week of Semester 1 and the first two weeks of semester 2. All assessed work from the Asynchronous learning period will be reported on semester 2 reports.

ES Asynchronous Learning is organized around learning packets. This is designed to give students access to the lessons and resources even if there are disruptions in internet availability.

- 1. Asynchronous packets are available in shared electronic folders shared by ES teachers and the TASOK Website.
- 2. The ES Asynchronous Packets are arranged by weeks 1, 2, and 3. Each week has an weekly outline that identifies the Must Do, Can Do, and Extension engagements.
- **3. Digital resource pages** are at the beginning of each week. Students who are in the DRC should download any related video files to allow access in the case of internet disruption. Students who will have stable internet access do not need to download the related files..

Students and parents will also have access to optional check-ins with teachers daily. Single subject teachers, EAL, and Learning support teachers will be online from 12:00-12:45 WAT. Homeroom teachers will be online from 13:00-13:45 WAT. Refer to the grade level learning packets for the Zoom and Goggle Meets connection information specific to each grade.

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

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## Supporting Students at Home During Asynchronous Learning

Asynchronous learning presents a unique blend of challenges and opportunities. Teachers worked very hard to provide meaningful learning tasks for students to engage in during the three weeks. While asynchronous learning can be challenging, it provides students with the flexibility to complete their schoolwork at their own pace and on their own schedule. By acknowledging the challenges and embracing the opportunities, asynchronous learning can become a powerful tool for personalized, effective, and engaging learning.

Here are some tips for supporting your child during asynchronous learning:

- **Establish a dedicated workspace**: Creating a designated learning area can help your child focus and stay on track. This space should be free from distractions and have everything they need to complete their work.
- Set a regular schedule: Just because asynchronous learning is flexible doesn't mean there should be no structure. Help your child create a daily schedule that includes time for schoolwork, breaks, and other activities. This will help them stay on track and avoid procrastination.
- **Communicate with teachers**: Stay in touch with your child's teachers to ask clarifying questions about the tasks assigned and/or to inform how your child is doing. Keep the office hour schedules handy, so either you or your child can stay in touch with the teachers.
- **Encourage breaks and movement**: It's important for students to take breaks during their study sessions to avoid burnout. They can go for a walk, stretch, or do some jumping jacks.
- **Provide support and encouragement**: Let your child know that you are there for them and that you believe in them. Offer help when needed, but also give them the space to work independently.
