What do you do at TASOK? I am a Tasok Driver and Tasok Mechanic. I do trips for the Tasok community which can be trips to the Ndjili Airport, taking students on Field trips and trips into town for Tasok Administration. I also maintain the Tasok vehicles.	What do you do at TASOK? I am a learning support Teaching Assistant and i'm working with the Grade 2 Class.
How long have you worked at TASOK? In October 2024 it will be 8 years working at Tasok	How long have you worked at TASOK? I have been working at Tasok for 4 years now.
What province are you from/which Kinshasa commune do you live in? I am originally from Mongala Province in the northern part of the DRC. My family and I live in Kalamu Commune, the area is called Camp Pinzi.	What province are you from/which Kinshasa commune do you live in? I'm from Kasai Orientale and I was born in Kinshasa. I live in Bandalungwa.
What do you appreciate about TASOK? I really enjoy the whole Tasok Community from the students to my work colleagues. I really enjoy seeing the Tasok Community for example when I went to the Thanksgiving event and also the Atelier Day when I brought my family to Tasok to see the place and the people I work with. My family also could see the Poster the students and teachers made for me thanking me for the work I do at Tasok.	What do you appreciate about TASOK? I appreciate the kindness and the open-mindedness of the TASOK community and the students I will like to highlight the diligent efforts that have been implemented to achieve positive progress in the school's development.
What job accomplishment are you most proud of during your time at TASOK? The first moment was when we were busy with the New Teacher Orientation Week and we were driving back from visiting the Bonobos when the Bus lost power because of the fuel filter. I climbed under the bus with my smart clothes and made a plan with the fuel filter so that we could get back to Tasok. Arriving back at Tasok I had to then go and buy a new Fuel filter the same day, and install it so that the bus was ready for a shopping trip the next day for the new teachers. The second time was when we were driving to Zongo Falls with the Tasok Teachers. The clutch gave problems, so I stayed with the bus and the teachers left for Zongo in another vehicle. That night the Chief of the village said his two sons could help me. Lucien, another Tasok mechanic/driver, joined me the next day. We then installed the new clutch plate and disc in very difficult conditions as it was not a Workshop but the back garden of the Village Chief. We then went to Zongo Falls and after two days we came back past the village where Dr Dan Mullen went to thank the village chief for his help in getting the bus repaired.	What job accomplishment are you most proud of during your time at TASOK? Seeing my learning supports students growing as risk takers, communicators, open minded and principled as well as seeing them being more independent.

What are you most proud of in the DRC? I am proud of the rich soils in the DRC that makes it really good for agriculture without the need for a lot of chemical fertilizers. What do you do as a hobby? I like practicing boxing on a Sunday. I like reading novels and developing my personal career.	What are you most proud of in the DRC? I am proud of the natural resources and fertile soil. What do you do as a hobby? I like reading and cooking with my kids .
What do you appreciate in your current position? My position really helps me develop my english.	What do you appreciate in your current position? I appreciate the fact that I am growing everyday and interacting with the students while helping them become responsible individuals in the future.





The TOK exhibition assesses the ability of Diploma candidates to show how TOK manifests in the world around us. For this task, students are required to create an exhibition of three objects that connect to one of the 35 "IA prompts" provided by the IB.

Over the course of the next few months, our Grade 11 students will develop their skills in doing in-depth research, critical thinking and analysis, writing, time management, and perseverance. 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


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Children's Author Visit: Marie COLOT

writing skills, by imagining and creating a character in their story or 'book'. Below are some of the pictures of the event. Additionally, the school bought some of her books that are available in the elementary library.







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
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Celebration of Learning - How We Organize Ourselves
