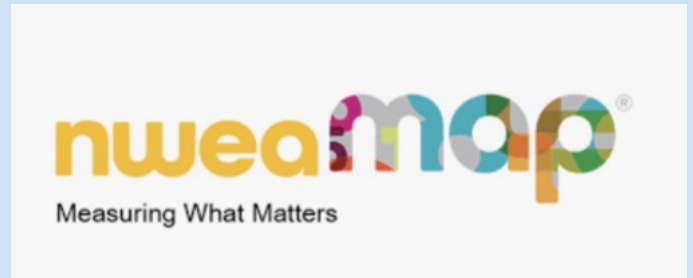

What you need to know about MAP Testing

In the month of May, all students at TASOK in G3-G10 will take part in MAP testing in Math, Reading and Language Arts.



How is MAP testing unique?

MAP stands for Measures of Academic Progress. The test is not a standardized test, rather this computer-adaptive test responds to the way a student is answering, so subsequent questions will be selected to provide an accurate picture of what the student knows. Correct answers and the test provides more challenging questions, incorrect answers and the test provides less challenging questions to give a complete picture of each students' learning.

Why is MAP testing reliable?

After completing the test, students will receive a RIT score. These scores are the students' achievement level in that subject area at that moment. RIT measures academic growth over time (compared with testing in September and previous years at TASOK). In addition, MAP Growth can be compared with other students testing in the same grade and the same subject around the world. Over 9 million students worldwide in over 140 countries take MAP testing, these are therefore considered consistently reliable measures.

How does TASOK use MAP testing?

TASOK uses MAP testing in a variety of ways. MAP testing guides teachers in grade levels to design units and lessons that respond to the needs of individual students and groups within a grade level. Teachers also use MAP data to work with students to set individual goals. We also evaluate data on MAP growth to adjust curriculum across grade levels and discuss the value of different interventions. MAP testing is one of many data points we use to evaluate the success of both individual students and our programs.

Preparing your student for MAP testing.

In preparation we ask families to look out for emails with MAP testing schedules, dates and times. Ensuring that students on the day of MAP testing are set with their charged device, a good nights' sleep and a healthy breakfast will set them up to perform at their ability level. Please discuss with your student the value of the testing and encourage them to do their best so that growth data is accurate. We thank you for your support in this partnership.

In the month of May, our MYP program will be gearing up for the transitions on both ends of the program!

They will learn everything they need to know about the Secondary school including: meeting new teachers, the Secondary timetables, using a locker, and how their school day will look different in the Fall! We are excited to welcome these students and get them prepared for the next steps in their educational journey!

Grade 10 Parent Night - On April 16th, TASOK hosted Grade 10 parents and students for an informational session about the DP program. We continue to love this format, where most of the information is coming directly from students taking the courses about what they love and what to expect from the class. Grade 11 TOK Exhibition - Grade 11 students had their Theory of Knowledge exhibition in the CAC on April 7th. This was the culminating event for year one of the Theory of Knowledge course. In TOK, students explore the nature of knowledge, how we acquire it, and its implications for different areas of knowledge. The exhibition allowed our students to display this knowledge through commentaries written about real-world objects.

Grade 11 Mini-Mocks - Our Grade 11 students will get a taste of what the next year's IB DP exams will be like at the end of May. Mini-mock exams will take place from May 20-23rd with morning and afternoon exams sessions modeled after the IB DP exams.

Grade 12 Exams - The IB DP Exams are underway and will continue until Friday, May 17th. Don't forget that DP Exams will take place on the holidays May 1st (Business Management & Mathematics) and May 17th (French acquisition and French Language & Literature). Good luck to all of our students!

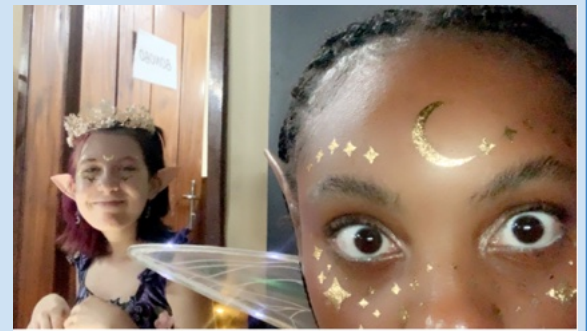
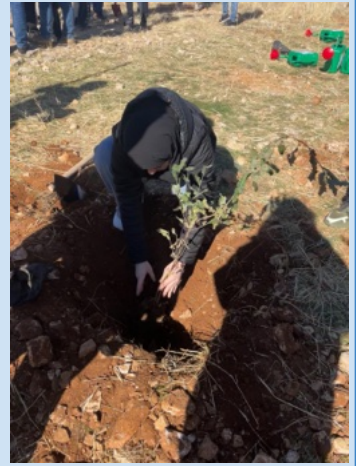


Secondary Engagement - CAS

PYP CORNER - Student-Led Conferences

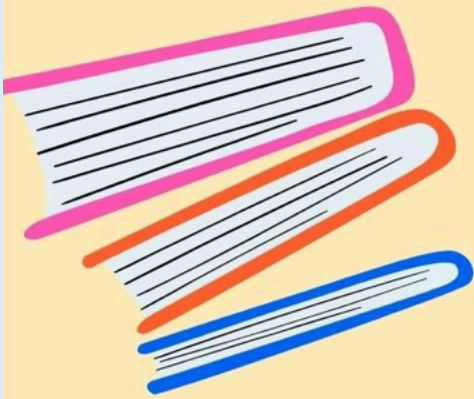
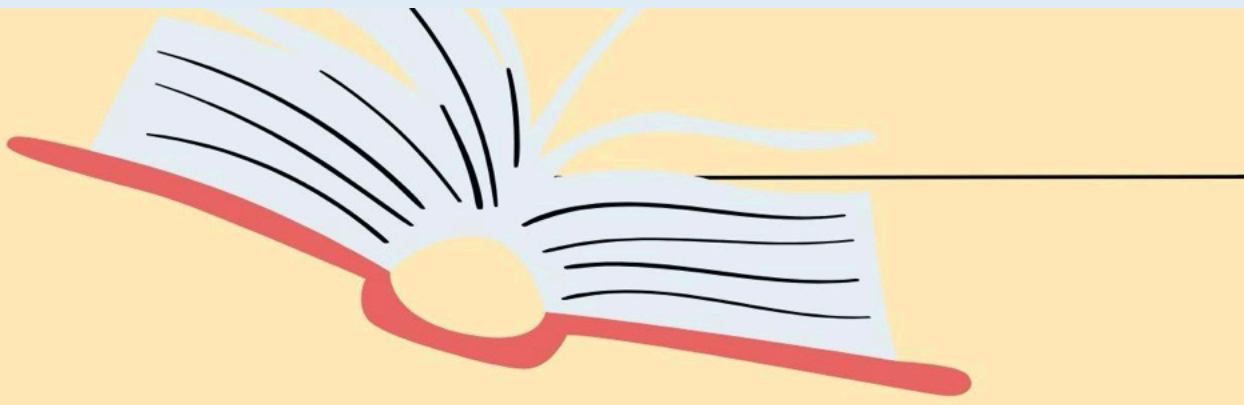

To the returning families, we ask that you stay tuned for the next steps.

- Tuition agreements and invoices will be issued starting May 6 until May 31.
- Learning Support & EAL invoices will be issued on the week of May 27 after assessments are completed by teachers.
- US Embassy, USAID, CDC & affiliates documents will be shared with their respective finance offices on the week of June 1.
- The 2024-25 Financial Aid applications open on May 6. The link and details will be posted on the school website www.tasok.net.

Important deadlines to note:

- June 3 - return all tuition agreements to confirm your payment plan
- June 3 - \$1000 re-enrollment guarantee is due
- June 6 - Financial Aid application window closes
- June 14 - Last day for UN & UN Agencies to request education grant forms signature
- June 21 - Last day for cash transactions with the Business Office. The cashier's counter will re-open on July 29.

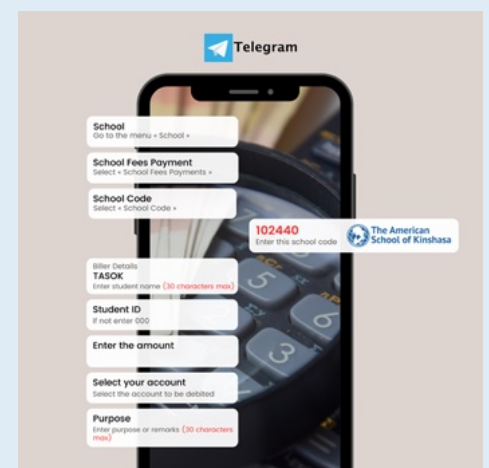

At TASOK, we continue to reinforce healthy practices.

Fever: Your child needs to be fever/fever relief medicine free for at least 24 hours before coming back to school.

Medication: For safety reasons we are not allowed students to carry their medicine, please give the medicine to the Nurse, so she can administer it to your child on a determinate time.

Make sure to let the nurse know as your child has an allergy or a chronic medical condition that is required to take medicine daily at school or if your child has a temporary prescription to take during the school hours. Send your child to the Nurse first thing in the morning after 2 days of sickness absence.

Birthdays: Please send the list of ingredients to the nurse at least 24 hours before the class celebration. Should your child be sick or absent for any reason, please share the information via: attendance@tasok.net
