Libraries

Library Catalog - Follett Destiny

TASOK uses Follett Destiny for all physical library resources. We have thousands of great books for education and recreational reading, and all TASOK staff members are welcome and encouraged to check out books from either library.

You can access the library catalog by going to destiny.tasok.net and logging in. Your username is your TASOK email before the @ (so mine is ledwards because my email is ledwards@tasok.com) and your password is your student ID number. If you have trouble logging in, please let us know!



TASOK also has a subscription to Sora, an online library shared between many international schools in Africa. Go to soraapp.com and follow the prompts to log in using the same credentials as your TASOK email account. Every person with a TASOK email has access to Sora.

Elementary Library

With the change to a 6 day rotation, the elementary library schedule is very different this year.


Mr. Morgan will continue to teach lessons to PreSchool, Kindergarten, and Grade 1. With the 6 day rotation, he will now see these classes twice per rotation. This way, they can spend more time engaging with books and using the library as it is intended.

Ms. Leanne will continue with Grade 2, 3, 4, and 5. These classes come to class only once a rotation, which means that some weeks some students may not have a library class. These students are especially encouraged to visit the library on their own time to find new books to read.

Students can check out up to 4 books at a time, so long as at least 1 of the books is in French. We have a nice selection of French books, ranging from beginner to advanced readers.



You don't need to log in to see the library catalog, but once you are logged in you can easily put books on hold so a librarian will find it for you.

Books will still be checked out for 2 weeks, although library classes are not held on the same day each week. We ask that books are returned as soon as you are finished with them, but we will be very flexible this year especially.

You will receive an email reminder once a week about which books are checked out. This is just a friendly reminder, not a demand that the books be returned right away, especially if you're not finished with them yet!

Secondary Library

Secondary students are welcome in the library before school, after school, and at lunch (after the first 15 minutes, after they eat their lunch). The library is a great space for working, reading, and quietly collaborating with friends. Please note that there is no eating in the Secondary library.

MYP students have 1 library lesson a week, during which there will be lessons on citation and academic integrity and other media literacy skills. These classes are also intended as Study Hall, with time for students to finish homework and work collaboratively on class work.

DP students have at least 1 Study Hall block per A/B rotation. Study Hall takes place in the Secondary Library, and is intended as an individual study opportunity for the students.

May 2024 IB Diploma exam results

In July, our departing Seniors, who sat for the May 2024 IB Diploma Exam Session, received individually and electronically their results. We are thrilled to announce that our number of IB Graduate students keeps increasing along with our passing rate (Covid time excluded).

20 TASOK IB candidates took the full IB Diploma last May. Half of them attempted an IB Bilingual French & English Diploma, which will prevent them from having to prove their proficiency level in either language to both Universities and future employers in any English or French speaking countries across the world. 15 of our candidates have been awarded either a bilingual or a regular IB Diploma.

One candidate has requested to retake a single exam in the November 2024 Session this year and we are confident in the candidate's success. We are also proud to announce the TASOK average grade of 32/45, which is 2 points higher than the IB World's average.

Grade 12 Mini-mock catch-up - Sep 9th-12th

The Diploma Programme is exam driven. It is therefore important to practice exam taking skills and exam preparation skills. This is the job of mock examinations. Mock exams provide strict exam condition experiences to help manage anxiety and improve on revision planning. They also provide reliable data for teachers who can extrapolate predictions and tailor lessons focusing on individual identified gaps.

This is why on Sep 9th-12th, our Seniors will catchup on the mini-mock exam they missed last May. Seniors voted themselves for the mini-Mock Exams to happen on that particular week in order to accommodate other DP deadlines that could have conflicted.

So, mark your calendar for Sep 9th-12th, four days during which Seniors will be off-schedule, revising and sitting for a maximum of 2 mock exams a day. Authorization forms will be sent home should you give your son or daughter permission to come later or leave earlier than regular school hours.

Grade 11/12 DP retreat day - Sep 13th

Following the mini-mocks, we are going to have our annual DP retreat, which involves both the Juniors and the Seniors. It is a kind of an induction event for our Grade 11 students who get a chance to learn from their fellow 12 Graders. This year, the event is directly planned by a couple of 12 Graders as one of their

Grade 12 Extended Essay final drafts It has been a long journey for our Seniors who are finally ready to hand in their best shot at their personal, articulated and educated response to the research question they had independently chosen a few months back. The extended essay, also known as the EE, is an independent research paper; it is a milestone in a full diploma candidate's life. Combined with TOK, it can provide up to 3 bonus points to boost exam results. May 2024 TASOK DP exam candidates obtained 1.5/3 bonus points in average. Please, join us in encouraging our 2025 TASOK International Baccalaureate candidates as they are entering the last 100 meter zone of this 4000 word endurance essay!





Letters of Recommendation: Make sure to request letters of recommendation from your teachers early. Provide them with any necessary information about your goals and achievements to help them write a strong letter.




We are excited to work with you throughout this journey and help you achieve your college and career goals. Please feel free to reach out to us with any questions or concerns.

- College Visits and Fairs: We encourage you to attend virtual and in-person college fairs and information sessions to learn more about different schools.



Please know that my door is always open to you. I look forward to working closely with you throughout the year to support your child's learning journey and ensure that TASOK remains where everyone feels they belong.


