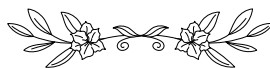


SPARKING ENGAGING DISCUSSIONS

MYP CORNER

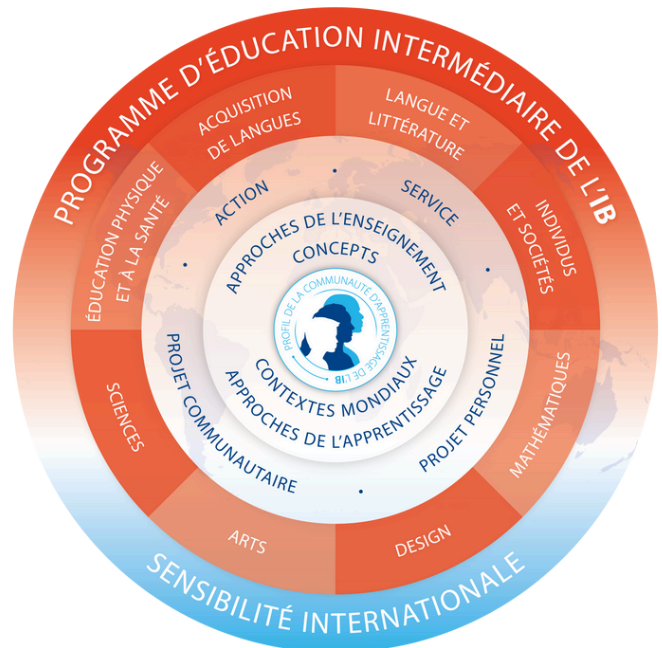

Title: Octopus Covered in Soup
Artist: Kellyanne Mahuku (Grade 8)
Medium: Glazed ceramics
Size: 5.5 x 7.6 x 2.5 cm

Kellyanne crafted a cartoon-style octopus inspired by her love for octopus with mushroom soup. Using a reference photo, she made a cute, zoomorphic figure with a round head and short tentacles. She used bright colors to emphasize its food-like appearance and created the base with a pinch-pot technique, adding legs for stability. Simple details, like a round mouth and textured ridges, evoke octopus features without full realism.

Title: Monstera
Artist: Sire Sanoh (Grade 8)
Medium: Glazed ceramics
Size: 17 x 10.5 cm

Inspired by a passion for the Amazon and nature, Sire created a realistic monstera leaf in ceramics. Using slab and coil techniques, he crafted the leaf shape and edges. Though his intended blue-green ombre with pink accents blended into solid green, the piece includes realistic leaf spaces typical of monstera leaves.



Title: Snake Bowl
Artist: Lea (Grade 8)
Medium: Glazed ceramics
Size: 7 x 15 x 7.5 cm

Lea designed a bowl featuring a snake wrapped around it, inspired by her love for snakes and their aesthetic form. Using vibrant, forest-inspired colors, she aimed for a smooth texture, though it turned out differently, adding unique character to the piece.



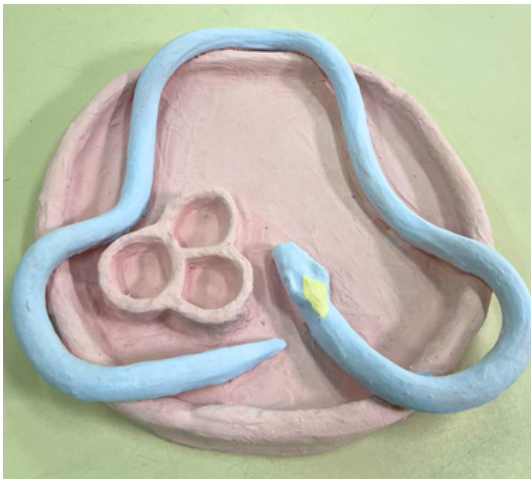
Title: The Snake Pot
Artist: Benjamin Defise (Grade 8)
Medium: Glazed ceramics
Size: 13 x 9 x 11 cm

Inspired by pottery featuring a snake, Benjamin created a pot with a snake coiled around it and a lid to view the inside. He aimed to add realism and design using techniques like scoring, slipping, and hand-building. The pot was shaped with a slab roller and pinch pot technique, while the snake was crafted with a clay extruder for added detail and life.

Title: Snake Plate
Artist: Vega Pehrsson (Grade 8)
Medium: Glazed ceramics
Size: 2.5 x 24 x 1.5 cm

Vega created a dark red plate with a contrasting blue snake with a yellow head, plus three small bowls. Inspired by Swedish forest snakes seen at a summer house, Vega crafted this zoomorphic plate using techniques like clay extrusion for the snake and walls, and the pinch technique for the bowls. The piece combines unique colors for an aesthetic, contrasting effect.



Title: The Turtles
Artist: Lucas Ossman (Grade 8)
Medium: Glazed ceramics
Size: 3 x 38 x 40 cm

Lucas crafted a green and blue sea turtle sculpture as a gift for his mom, inspired by her love of turtles. Using slab and coil techniques, with a ball for the head, he created a sleek, curved, and natural design.



Title: Snake Wrap Bowl
Artist: Parignya (Grade 8)
Medium: Glazed ceramics
Size: 7.5 x 14 x 6 cm

Parignya crafted a "snake wrap bowl" featuring a coiled snake to symbolize eternity and divine knowledge. Using hand-building and coil techniques, they added realistic snake curves and a shiny glaze to enhance the design's visual impact and symbolism.

Title: Guatemalan Monkey Vase
Artist: Jimmy Parys (Grade 8)
Medium: Glazed ceramics
Size: 10 x 15 x 19 cm

Jimmy created a zoomorphic vase featuring a Guatemalan monkey, inspired by his interest in natural forms. He aimed to make it both aesthetic and engaging by adding monkey features and enhancing the design with curves and details that evoke the monkey's likeness. He crafted the piece using hand-building techniques to blend natural beauty with functionality.

Title: Sea Creature Bowls

Artist: Oriane Bodson (Grade 8)

Medium: Glazed ceramics

Sizes: Turtle bowl: 3.6 x 9.5 x 8 cm; Starfish bowl: 1.5 x 8.9 x 9 cm

Oriane crafted a set of jewelry bowls inspired by sea creatures. Her green turtle bowl features layered green hues and a detailed shell pattern, while her pink starfish bowl contrasts with a pink exterior and white interior. Both pieces were designed for storing jewelry or small items, combining aesthetic design with functionality.

Hello Tasok Community

The college application season is officially underway! We understand this can be both an exciting and overwhelming time as you prepare for the next steps in your educational journey. To help you stay on track, here are a few key tips to consider when applying:

- **Stay Organized:** Use a calendar or planner to track deadlines for each school, including application due dates, financial aid forms, and scholarship applications. Missing deadlines can impact your chances, so stay ahead!
- **Highlight Your Unique Strengths:** Be authentic in your essays and application materials. Showcase what makes you unique—whether it's your leadership experience, community involvement, or a personal passion.
- **Request Letters of Recommendation Early:** Give your recommenders plenty of notice to write thoughtful letters that speak to your strengths. Remember, a good recommendation can leave a strong impression on admissions committees.

- **Prepare for Interviews:** Not all colleges require interviews, but if yours does, prepare by practicing common questions and researching the institution. This is your chance to express why you're a great fit!
- **Proofread Everything:** Review all parts of your application carefully. Typos and mistakes can take away from an otherwise impressive application, so take your time with each component.

Additionally, we want to remind you that there will be one last SAT offered this year, scheduled for December 7. If you plan to take it, make sure to register by November 22.

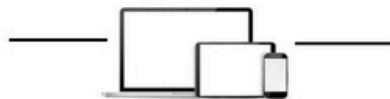

- ↔ **PLACE** your weekly order for each member of your family registered in the canteen

REMEMBER THIS WHEN ORDERING MEALS:

- ↔ **MEALS ARE PREPARED AND SERVED ON THE BASIS OF ORDERS MADE ONLINE:** in the absence of an order, the child cannot be served, even if the E-Pocket is sufficiently credited.
- ↔ **WEEKLY ORDER** . Orders are made over an entire week to avoid any oversights that could leave a child without a lunch. It is strongly recommended to place weekly orders over the weekend.
- ↔ **DAY-TO-DAY ORDER** . Orders are placed at least the day before no later than 8:59 p.m. in order to be available on the following day. Orders placed after 9:00 p.m. will not be prepared. Same day orders for lunch are available for limited products (Sandwiches, Wraps and Salad) between 12am-8am only.
- ↔ **CANCELLATION OF THE ORDER** . Cancellation of orders can only be made by email: orders@ekonizomiz.com and based on the following:
 - 1 **Hot meals** : Cancel the day before no later than 11:59 pm
 - 2 **Sandwiches**: Cancel the day before or the same day no later than 6:00 a.m.

Meals will not be refunded if a child is absent. Only an order canceled within the prescribed time results in a corresponding refund in the user's electronic pocket.

A total interruption of the school canteen service (school closure, force majeure) also gives rise to a refund.

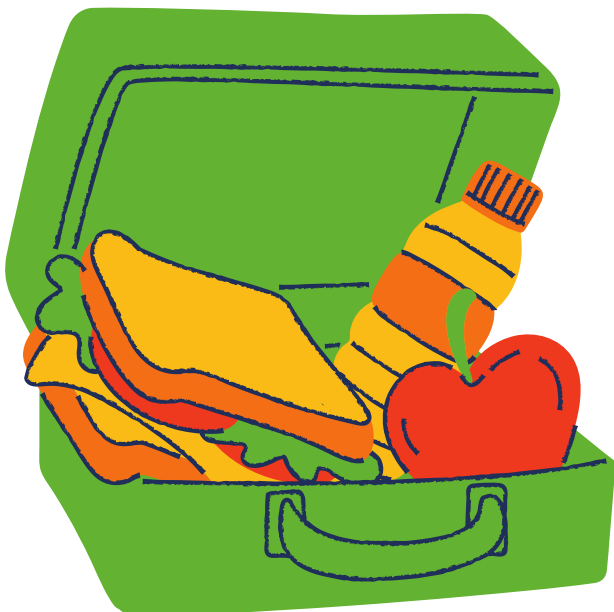

At TASOK, we continue to reinforce healthy practices.

Fever: Your child needs to be fever/fever relief medicine-free for at least 24 hours before coming back to school.

Medication: For safety reasons, we do not allow students to carry their medicine. Please give the medicine to the Nurse so that she can administer it to your child at a designated time.

Make sure to let the nurse know if your child has an allergy or a chronic medical condition that requires taking medicine daily at school or if your child has a temporary prescription to take during school hours.

Send your child to the Nurse first thing in the morning after 2 days of sickness absence.

Birthdays: Please send the list of the cupcake ingredients to the nurse at least 48 hours before the class celebration.
